

## **PE PREMIUM FUNDING REPORT – 2015/16**

During the academic year 2015-16, the school received a total of £9,785 in central government funded PE and Sports Premium funding.

This was spent as follows:

- £3,100 to Mid-Sussex Active, who act as a central provider of PE professional development opportunities for school staff and run a multitude of inter-school sporting events across the district.
- £1,500 was spent on facilities/equipment.
- £1,300 was used to fund supply cover to allow school staff to accompany children to inter-school events that take place during the school day.
- £3,561 was used to fund weekly release time for the school's PE co-ordinator to support teaching staff and pupils across the school in raising standards.

During the year, the PE co-ordinator used the weekly PE Premium release time to support the school, its pupils and staff in the following ways:

- Year 6: Co-ordinator led and team teach athletics and gymnastic sessions.
- Year 5: teach teaching of hockey and tag rugby.
- Year 4: PE co-ordinator run gifted and talented tennis.
- Year 3: team teaching of athletics.
- Year 2: Co-ordinator led and team teach athletics sessions

The attainment and achievement of pupils was particularly impressive during 2015-16 with the school achieving competition success in:

- Boys' football – Haywards Heath winners, Mid-Sussex winners and Sussex semi-finalists in the ESFA 7-a-side competition.
- Girls' football – Haywards Heath ESFA 7-a-side competition winners.
- Cross country – Mid Sussex boys' team winners, Mid-Sussex girls' team runners up, 7 boys and 6 girls qualified for the district finals, 3 girls and 2 boys were selected to represent the district team at the county finals.
- Athletics – Haywards Heath Sportshall athletics winners, Mid-Sussex Sportshall athletics runners-up.

The school was again awarded the Gold School Games kitemark. The following statistics highlight ever-increasing levels of participation and leadership opportunities (the data refers to children in Years 1-6).

- 96% of children were engaged in an extra-curricular sporting activity every week (this includes participation in lunchtime clubs and Play-leader led activities).
- The school offered School Games Level 1 intra-school competition opportunities in 15 different sports, including Boccia and New-Age Kurling.
- School teams participated in School Games Level 2 inter-school competitions against other schools in 14 different sports.

- As well as the "A" teams that took part in local inter-school competitions, additional teams had inter-school competition opportunities in 12 different sports.
- 37% of children acted as leaders and/or officials during intra or inter-school School Games competitions.

During 2016-17 sports premium funding will be used to enhance ongoing provision in the following ways:

- Providing access to Sportcrew training for year 6 pupils to run activities for targeted groups across the school.
- The school's affiliation to the MSA allows for ever-improving club links.
